SOCIALIST CAROLE DELGA IS BEST REELECTED PRESIDENT OF OCCITANIA REGION WITH 58,5%

AND BECAME PDT OF THE FRENCH REGIONS

USPA NEWS - Carole Delga, the outgoing president of Occitanie Carole Delga of the French Socialist Party, (PS) obtained a score obtains 58.5% of the vote against 23.9% for Jean-Paul Garraud (RN) and 18.3% for the head of the LR list (Les Républicains, Right Party) Aurélien Pradie according to the estimates of Ipsos / Sopra Steria for France Télévisions / Radio France / The Parliamentary Channel). This is the highest score of the candidates in the regional elections of the second round, and allows Carole Delga who is therefore re-elected President of the Occitania region and will therefore preside over the twenty two regions of France by her score. Carole Delga, who had been Secretary of State for Commerce in June 2014, has all the same, climbed the steps of the political ladder starting after being Territorial attaché in charge of the historical and archaeological heritage of the city of Limoges in 1994 Before becoming today the Presidency of the twenty two regions of France, slowly... but surely.

POLITICAL BACKGROUND AND BIOGRAPHY OF CAROLE DELGA NEW PDT OF THE 22 FRENCH REGIONS

Carole Delga studied in Toulouse and Montpellier's Universities, she joined the territorial public service, as a Territorial attaché, she joined the Town Hall of Limoges in 1994 as responsible for the historical and archaeological heritage of the city. In 1998, she became director of the Syndicat des eaux de la Barousse, then, in 2005, deputy director of land use planning for the Midi-Pyrénées Region, where she also held the position of project manager to the deputy director general in charge of regional planning, economic development and sustainable development pole. After terms of mayor and deputy as well as ministerial functions, in 2016 she became the first president of the new Occitania / Pyrénées-Méditerranée region. In June 2021, Carole Delga was reelected as President of the Region.-----

Occitania remains on the left, very largely, socialist thanks to the result of 58.5% of the vote according to the estimates of the outgoing socialist president Carole Delga who thus achieves the highest score of this ballot. Compared to 2015, it gained nearly 15 points (44.81%). It thus precedes the candidate of the National Assembly Jean-Paul Garraud (23.5%) and the deputy LR Aurélien Pradie (18%). She had also refused any alliance including, with France Insoumise, (LFI), Far left party of Jean Luc Melenchon,) who came in sixth position in the first round (5.06%), considering that her project was not "Not compatible" with the speech of Jean Luc Melenchon. For his part, the candidate of the RN (National Rally, Far Right, Party of Marine le Pen) is progressing very slightly compared to the first round (22.61%). Aurélien Pradie gained 4 points (12.19%).

OCCITANIA IS THE 1ST REGION IN FRANCE TO ADOPT A GREEN BUDGET-----

The Region's initial 2020 budget stands at 3.53 billion euros, and includes 1.24 billion investments. Focused on a balanced development of the territory and the quality of life of the inhabitants of Occitania, it ensures the improvement of daily life and prepares for the future. In order to objectively assess its commitment to climate transition, the Occitania Region is the first in France to set up, from 2021, a rigorous classification of its expenditure. In collaboration with the Institute for Climate Economics each of them was assessed to see if they were beneficial for the climate. Thus, 26% of the expenditures of the 2021 Budget are very favorable (16%) or favorable (10%). And only 4% of regional spending has an unfavorable impact, such as air transport or national and departmental roads. The objective is to improve this impact each year in line with the "Positive Energy Region" strategy.-----

Finally, tourism, a major activity for the regional territory, will benefit from a budget of 87.5 million euros. It will make it possible to continue to support businesses and tourist establishments which have been hit hard by the crisis. But the ambition is also to support balanced and sustainable tourism development based on innovation, among other things through Tourism Passes and Contracts. (Source: Occitania Region)
